NUOVA RELAZIONE CON GESÙ

Nelle comunità cristiane abbiamo bisogno di vivere un'esperienza nuova di Gesù, ravvivando la nostra relazione con lui. Porlo decisamente al centro della nostra vita. Passare da un Gesù confessato in maniera routinaria a un Gesù accolto vitalmente. L'evangelo di Giovanni dà alcune indicazioni importanti nel parlare della relazione delle pecore con il loro Pastore.

La prima è «ascoltare la sua voce» in tutta la sua freschezza e originalità. Non confonderla con il rispetto delle tradizioni né con la novità delle mode. Non lasciarsi distrarre né confondere da altre voci estranee che, anche se si ascoltano all'interno della Chiesa, non comunicano la sua Buona Notizia.

È importante sentirci chiamati da Gesù «per nome». Lasciarci attrarre da lui. Scoprire a poco a poco e sempre con più gioia, che nessuno risponde come lui alle nostre domande più decisive, ai nostri aneliti più profondi e alle nostre ultime necessità.

È decisivo «seguire» Gesù. La fede cristiana non consiste nel credere in cose su Gesù, ma nel credere in lui, vivere confidando nella sua persona; ispirarci al suo stile di vita per orientare la nostra esistenza con lucidità e responsabilità.

La mancanza di fede inizia a penetrare in noi dal momento stesso in cui la nostra relazione con Gesù perde forza, o resta addormentata nella routine, nell'indifferenza e nel disinteresse. Per questo, Papa Francesco ha riconosciuto che "abbiamo bisogno di creare spazi motivazionali e risanatori [...] luoghi in cui rigenerare la fede in Gesù". Dobbiamo ascoltare il suo appello.

A NEW RELATIONSHIP WITH JESUS In our Christian communities we need to live a new experience with Jesus. reviving our relationship with him. We need to put him decisively in the centre of our life. We need to move from a Jesus confessed in a routine way, to a Jesus welcomed in a vital way. The Gospel of John gives us some important suggestions when it speaks of the relationship of the sheep

with their shepherd.

The first is «listen to his voice» in its full freshness and originality. Don't cast it in relation to traditions or to the fad of the day. Don't allow ourselves to be distracted or upset by other strange voices that, though they're heard from within the Church, don't communicate the Good News. It's important to feel ourselves called by Jesus «by our name». We need to let ourselves be attracted to him. We need to discover, little by little and more joyfully each day, that no one responds like he does to our most decisive guestions, our most profound yearnings, our deepest

It's decisive to «follow» Jesus. The Christian faith doesn't consist in believing things about Jesus, but in believing IN Jesus: living and confiding in his person. We need to be inspired by his way of life.

Unbelief starts to penetrate us from the very moment that our relationship with Jesus loses its force, or ends up put to sleep by routine, indifference and carelessness. That's why Pope Francis has recognized that «we need to create motivational and healthy spaces...places to regenerate faith in Jesus». We need to listen to this call.

First Reading Acts 2:14. 36-41

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

On the day of Pentecost Peter stood up with the Eleven and addressed the crowd with a loud voice: 'The whole House of Israel can be certain that God has made this Jesus whom you crucified both Lord and Christ.' Hearing this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the apostles, 'What must we do, brothers?' 'You must repent,' Peter answered 'and every one of you must be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. The promise that was made is for you and your children, and for all those who are far away, for all those whom the Lord our God will call to himself.' He spoke to them for a long time using many arguments, and he urged them, 'Save yourselves from this perverse generation.' They were convinced by his arguments, and they accepted what he said and were baptised. That very day about three thousand were added to their number.

Second Reading 1 Pt 2:20-25

A reading from the first letter of St Peter

The merit, in the sight of God, is in bearing punishment patiently when you are punished after doing your duty. This, in fact, is what you were called to do, because Christ suffered for you and left an example for you to follow the way he took. He had not done anything wrong, and there had been no perjury in his mouth. He was insulted and did not retaliate with insults; when he was tortured, he made no threats, but he put his trust in the righteous judge. He was bearing our faults in his own body on the cross, so that we might die to our faults and live for holiness; through his wounds you have been healed. You had gone astray like sheep but now you have come back to the shepherd and guardian of your souls.

Gospel Jn 10:1-10

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Jesus said: 'I tell you most solemnly, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold through the gate but gets in some other way is a thief and a brigand. The one who enters through the gate is the shepherd of the flock; the gatekeeper lets him in, the sheep hear his voice, one by one he calls his own sheep and leads them out. When he has brought out his flock, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow because they know his voice. They never follow a stranger but run away from him: they do not recognise the voice of strangers.' Jesus told them this parable, but they failed to understand what he meant by telling it to them. So Jesus spoke to them again: 'I tell you most solemnly, I am the gate of the sheepfold. All others who have come are thieves and brigands; but the sheep took no notice of them. I am the gate. Anyone who enters through me will be safe: he will go freely in and out and be sure of finding pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I have come so that they may have life and have it to the full.'
