

LO SPIRITO DELLA VERITÀ

Gesù si sta congedando dai suoi discepoli. Li vede tristi e abbattuti. Presto non lo avranno più con loro. Chi potrà riempire il vuoto che lascia? Fino ad ora è stato lui a curarsi di loro, li ha difesi dagli scribi e dai farisei, ha sostenuto la loro fede debole e vacillante, ha scoperto loro a poco a poco la verità di Dio e li ha iniziati al suo progetto umanizzatore.



THE SPIRIT OF TRUTH

Jesus is saying goodbye to his disciples. He sees them sad and upset. Soon they won't have him with them. Who can fill that void? Until now he has been the one who took care of them. defended them from the Scribes and Pharisees, sustained their weak and faltering faith, described for them the truth of God, and initiated them into God's humanizing project.

Gesù parla loro appassionatamente dello Spirito. Jesus speaks to them passionately about the Spirit. truth». What is hidden behind these words of Jesus?

> This «Spirit of truth» invites us to live in the truth of Jesus in the midst of a society where all too often lies are called strategy, exploitation is called business, irresponsibility is called tolerance, injustice is called status quo, arbitrariness is called freedom, lack of respect is called sincerity....

> What meaning does Jesus' Church have if we allow ourselves in our communities to lose this «Spirit of truth»?

> Who can save it from self-deception, dead ends, generalized mediocrity?

> Who will announce the Good News of Jesus in a society that is so in need of encouragement and hope?

Chi potrà salvarla dall'autoinganno, dalle deviazioni e dalla mediocrità generalizzata?

Chi annunzierà la Buona Notizia di Gesù in una società tanto bisognosa di coraggio e di speranza?

Philip went to a Samaritan town and proclaimed the Christ to them. The people united in welcoming the message Philip preached, either because they had heard of the miracles he worked or because they saw them for themselves. There were, for example, unclean spirits that came shrieking out of many who were possessed, and several paralytics and cripples were cured. As a result, there was great rejoicing in that town. When the apostles in Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them, and they went down there, and prayed for the Samaritans to receive the Holy Spirit, for as yet he had not come down on any of them: they had only been baptised in the name of the Lord Jesus. Then they laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

(R.) Let all the earth cry out to God with joy.

- 1. Cry out with joy to God all the earth, O sing to the glory of his name. O render him glorious praise. Say to God: 'How tremen dous your deeds! (R.)
- 2. 'Before you all the earth shall bow; shall sing to you, sing to your name!' Come and see the works of God, tremendous his deeds among men. (R.)

Second Reading 1 Pt 3:15-18 A reading from the first letter of St Peter

Reverence the Lord Christ in your hearts, and always have your answer ready for people who ask you the reason for the hope that you all have. But give it with courtesy and respect and with a clear conscience, so that those who slander you when you are living a good life in Christ may be proved wrong in the accusations that they bring. And if it is the will of God that you should suffer, it is better to suffer for doing right than for doing wrong. Why, Christ himself, innocent though he was, had died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life.

Alleluia, alleluia! All who love me will keep my words, and my Father will love them, and we will come to them. Alleluia!

Gospel Jn 14:15-21 A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Jesus said to his disciples: 'If you love me you will keep my commandments. I shall ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to be with you for ever, that Spirit of truth whom the world can never receive since it neither sees nor knows him; but you know him, because he is with you, he is in you. I will not leave you orphans; I will come back to you. In a short time, the world will no longer see me; but you will see me, because I live, and you will live. On that day you will understand that I am in my Father and you in me and I in you. Anybody who receives my commandments and keeps them will be one who loves me; and anybody who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I shall love him and show myself to him.'

IMPORTANT UPDATE - MASSES AT ST LUKE'S CHURCH

We are pleased to announce that as of last Tuesday, St Luke's will again be able to hold masses in the Church, as advised by the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne, in accordance with strict guidelines: As of midnight Monday 13 April permission has been extended for churches to be considered as workplaces for the purposes of broadcasting or live-streaming liturgies.

This timeline has been extended until the end of May 2020.

Maximum of 10 people only in attendance.

Maintenance of 1.5m social distancing rule.

Hand sanitiser and disinfectant wipes to be made available.

All attendees to provide contact details (First Name + Contact Number)

Church to be cleaned and sanitised after every Mass;

Hygiene precautions must be maintained throughout;

Doors must remain closed to prevent public access.

No lingering outside the church.

Apart from the usual Sunday mass times, we also have made available several other mass times during the week. Parishioners will need to register their interest for a mass

(limit of 10). Please call the office to register.

Only the minimum required for the proper conduct of the Liturgy and its broadcasting/live-streaming are permitted to be present; for example:

A Server

Up to 2 Readers

A Musician and Singer

Videographers/Technicians

Building capacity limits must be maintained at all times;

It is important that the Sacrament of Anointing be available to those seriously ill and in danger of death.

People who identify within themselves the need for Confession should contact their Parish clergy directly.

Collection plates cannot be passed. (collection baskets on a table at end of the Church). Envelopes should be placed there.

We have a new method of a portal, please see all the information on the parish bulletin No Missal books but bulletins would be fine if they are 'one use.'

Signage must clearly indicate that they should be taken home;

The Church is going to be open 15 minutes before the Mass.

The Carpark and the Parish Hall is going to be close until the restrictions are lifted. We continue to do live-streaming masses in English, Italian and Vietnamese.

MASS ONLINE

In light of the current crisis, all Catholics in Victoria are dispensed from their Sunday obligation until further notice (canon 1248). We encourage you to continue active participation in the life of the Church, through activities such as time in personal and family prayer, reflecting on the Scriptures, making a spiritual communion, or participating in a Mass online.
